

YOUR BAHA'I TEMPLE TURNS 50 THIS YEAR! COME AND CELEBRATE 18 TO 25 SEPTEMBER 2011

The Australian Baha'i Temple is a gift to the community, a place of prayer and meditation open to all. It aims to bring all people together to learn and participate in creating a better world. Located in the beautiful hills and bushland above the northern beaches of Sydney, it is one of seven Baha'i Temples throughout the world.

You may have driven past it or seen its dome from afar — the week-long anniversary celebrations are the perfect time to come and visit. You are welcome to participate in one or as many events as you like. Activities include daily services in the tranquillity of the Temple, a special evening interfaith service for the International Day of Peace, a children's art exhibition on building a peaceful community, an archival display, a guided tour day and a festive community day with activities for all ages. Admission is free.

A typical Temple service is 45 minutes, includes readings from the sacred writings of the major religions of the world and a capella performances by the Baha'i Temple choir and other singers. Ordinary members of the community — men and women, adults and children — read the texts.
